We are small and intimate—only 10 cabañas, but situated on 175 acres of nature reserve with one mile of frontage on the Macal River and a working organic farm.

We are in the jungle—that means the occasional bug, uneven terrain, and night noises from animals. It also means mud, rain, and bumpy roads. But we're close to San Ignacio—only 5 miles by paved road and easily accessible via rental car, public bus, or taxi.

We are an award-winning environmentally sustainable lodge—thus, we produce our own electricity. Because of this, air conditioning is not available, but it isn't missed much with the use of our industrial ceiling fans and in our area's comfortable climes.

We are fully staffed—two chefs, a concierge, bartenders, and other service staff allow for our guests' needs to be met rapidly.

Our gourmet dining can't be beat—but we are small and in the jungle, so there is limited choice and times for meals, and reservations are required.

They came for an adventure . . .

Purchased as only thick jungle and an abandoned farm, Table Rock has been hewn into the rainforest and has continued to develop since the first walking trail was chopped by machete in 2002. The lodge's original founders worked diligently to make Table Rock unique by preserving the natural surroundings, utilizing solar power, keeping the number of rooms limited, employing local villagers, and by replenishing one of Belize's earliest natural resources—the Mahogany Tree.

Alan, the owner of a private investigation firm, and Colleen, a former special education teacher and school administrator, honeymooned in Belize in 1998 with only a tent, a rented 4×4, an axe, and a map of questionable accuracy. They fell in love with the country and its people, and continued coming back to vacation on a regular basis. After several years of courtship with Belize, the couple decided to take the leap and stay on more permanently, starting first in a tent with no running water, no electricity, and only a rough idea of starting a citrus farm. Five years and many ideas and learning experiences later, Table Rock Jungle Lodge first opened for business.

That tradition continues today through the amazing people who visit Table Rock and through the lodge's incredibly dedicated staff who make its guests feel like part of the family and take every opportunity to teach others about this incredible country.


